Resolution 2002-1 of the Fox Canyon Groundwater Management Agency

A RESOLUTION CONCERNING USE OF THE STATE WATER ENTITLEMENT

WHEREAS, the mission of the Fox Canyon Groundwater Management Agency (Agency) includes the protection and preservation of the groundwater resources within the boundaries of the Agency; and

WHEREAS, a prime goal of the Agency is to enhance available water supplies wherever possible, and aid all efforts available to add to the potential annual water supply to benefit the groundwater aquifers; and

WHEREAS, any means of allocating State water supplies to replenish or replace local groundwater is consistent with Agency purpose; and

WHEREAS, the United Water Conservation District (District), holds entitlement to California State Water Project supplies of 3,150 acre-feet per year; and

WHEREAS, the District can deliver all or part of that entitlement to the benefit of the Agency; and

WHEREAS, the delivery of State Project Water for recharge is beneficial to the aquifer system;

THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that the Agency fully supports the plan to import State Project Water for Recharge proposed by the District wherein said District will perform a hydrologic accounting and submit to the Agency a request for credits after each instance when State Project Water is imported for groundwater recharge. District shall hold credits so earned in a trust to be dispersed on mutual agreement with the Agency. The use of these credits shall be to resolve, or contribute to the resolution of, a unique groundwater issue of concern to both agencies.

On motion by Director Fox, and seconded by Director Schwabauer, the foregoing resolution was passed and adopted on the 27th day of November, 2002.
