The Adjudication does not seek to determine rights to municipal water service between any municipal water service provider and their retail water service customers. The City of Oxnard, City of Ventura, City of Camarillo, Camrosa Water District, Port Hueneme Water Agency, and Channel Islands Beach Community Services District are already parties to the case.
