Background

- FCGMA has funded staff and legal efforts for the appeal of Watermaster Rules
 - No Watermaster Fund was available at the time of appeal
 - Watermaster Fund created April 2024
 - Purpose of the appeal was to improve Watermaster Rules for efficient implementation
- Estimated cost of appeal in FY 2024-25 are \$400,000

Watermaster Fund Balance

- Initial budget adopted with no operating reserves
- Significant delinquent payments
- Timing of assessment payments creates cash flow issue in early FY 24-25
 - Assumes FCGMA is reimbursed for staff and legal costs

FCGMA Resolution 2020-05 (GEMES)

- \$20.00 Acre-Foot charge (GEMES Fee)
- to fund "actions and proceedings related to the Agency's implementation of groundwater sustainability plans for the Basins."
- LPV Judgment incorporates the GSP into physical solution
- GEMES Fund may be used to pay for the appeal or any other post-judgment proceedings in the LPV Adjudication, including fees for judicial review of Watermaster's implementation of the judgment.

Factors to consider:

- Should the costs be paid by all FCGMA pumpers or just those who obtained water rights under the Judgment?
- Should the FCGMA should continue to include the LPV Basin Adjudication in future budgets for the GEMES Fund?
- Do the costs advance the Watermaster's compliance with the Judgment?
